1870 Census Instructions

- Assistant Marshals will begin the enumeration of their subdivisions, June 1, and continue it without interruption till the work is complete. Intermission of work will be sufficient cause for removal.
- Assistant Marshals will report progress to the Marshal regularly once a fortnight: failure to do so will be sufficient cause for removal.
- Each Assistant will provide himself with a secure portable inkstand, good ink, and a sufficient number of pens. All entries will be carefully dried with the blotting paper which accompanies each portfolio.

1872 Census Statistics

- Two Years After the Census data is Collected, Demographic and Statistical Data is Released
- No Names
- Includes Counts by Occupation
- Other Summary Data

1870 Census Only Listed Reputable Occupations! Excluded Gamblers ! Prostitutes! Keepers of Brothels! And Other Such Persons!

The following tables embrace gainful and reputable occupations only. While expressing the employments of more than twelve millions and a half of persons, they do not seek to account for the larger number of those within the same periods of life who have no recognized occupation for which they receive compensation in the shape of wages or salary, or from which they derive products of a merchantable character. All persons, moreover, whose means of livelihood are criminal, or, in the general judgment of mankind, shameful, are excluded.

The reason for excluding gamblers, prostitutes, keepers of brothels, and such persons from the Tables of Occupations, has not been found in any sensitiveness at the mention or recognition of these classes as actually existing in the community, but in the consideration that, from the necessity of the case, the numbers thus reported must be wholly inadequate to the fact, and that a seeming count of them in the census would have the effect to mislead rather

Excluded Because Government Doubted Accuracy

1870 Census Statistics

- Population of the U.S. was 38 million
- 37 States and 10 Territories (47 ??)
- Texas had 821,000 people, 19th largest
- Kansas had 364,000 people, 29th largest
- Oklahoma (Indian Territory) – No Census taken!



FIRE DESTROYS CENSUS DATA OF 120 YEARS

Irreplacable Records Are
Ruined by Smoke
And Water.

FUMES OVERCOME
TWO FIREFIGHTERS

T. J. Fitzgerald, chief clerk of the Census Bureau, stated that it was unlikely that the records had been actually burned, but that much of the valuable and original data collected by the bureau during the past 120 years had been rendered worthless by water and smoke.

The 1890 census, which was the most detailed and voluminous of any of the fourteen censuses taken by the government, was placed in such a position in the vault to be first in the path of the firemen. They contained detailed data on the country's 85,000,000 people of that time.

GEORGETOWN, Oct. 3.—Mrs. A. J. Hanna, a pioneer citizen of this county, died at her home in Georgetown Wednesday night, following an illness of several days. Funeral services were conducted at the home by Rev. W. C. Moffett, pastor of the Baptist church, at 10 o'clock this Friday morning, and interment was in the L. O. O. F. cemetery at Georgetown.

Mrs. Hanna was born in 1853 near Austin, Travis county, and came to Williamson county following her marriage to A. J. Hanna in 1883. Besides her husband she leaves four children, W. H. Hanna of Rusk, A. J. Hanna Jr. of Alpine, J. R. Hanna and Miss Addie Hanna of Georgetown, all of whom were at her bedside when she passed away. Mrs. Hanna leaves also three sisters, Mrs. L. J. Williams and Mrs. A. E. Moore of Austin and Mrs. J. Brewer of Runnels county. Several nieces and nephews survive her, one of whom is R. E. Moore of Georgetown, county clerk of Williamson county.

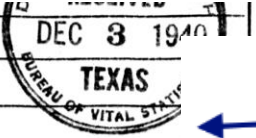
